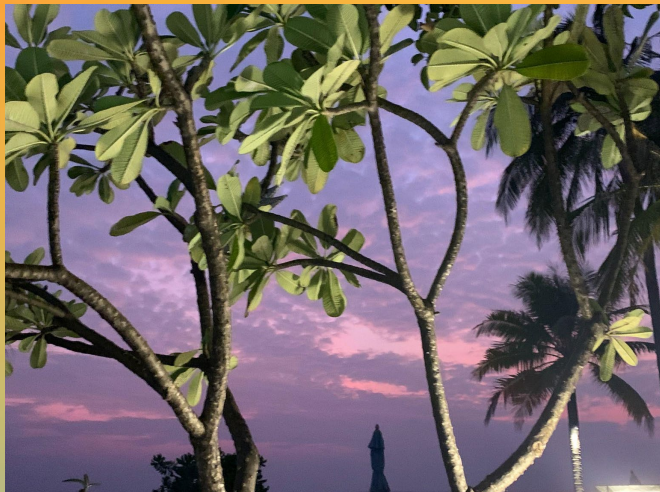
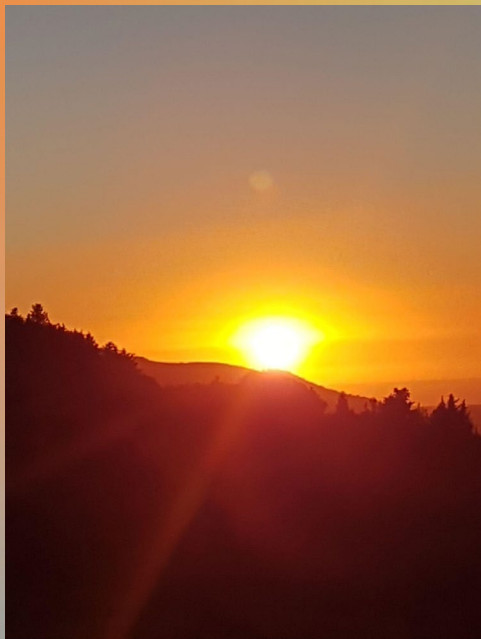
Yilan - Cedars - Y7

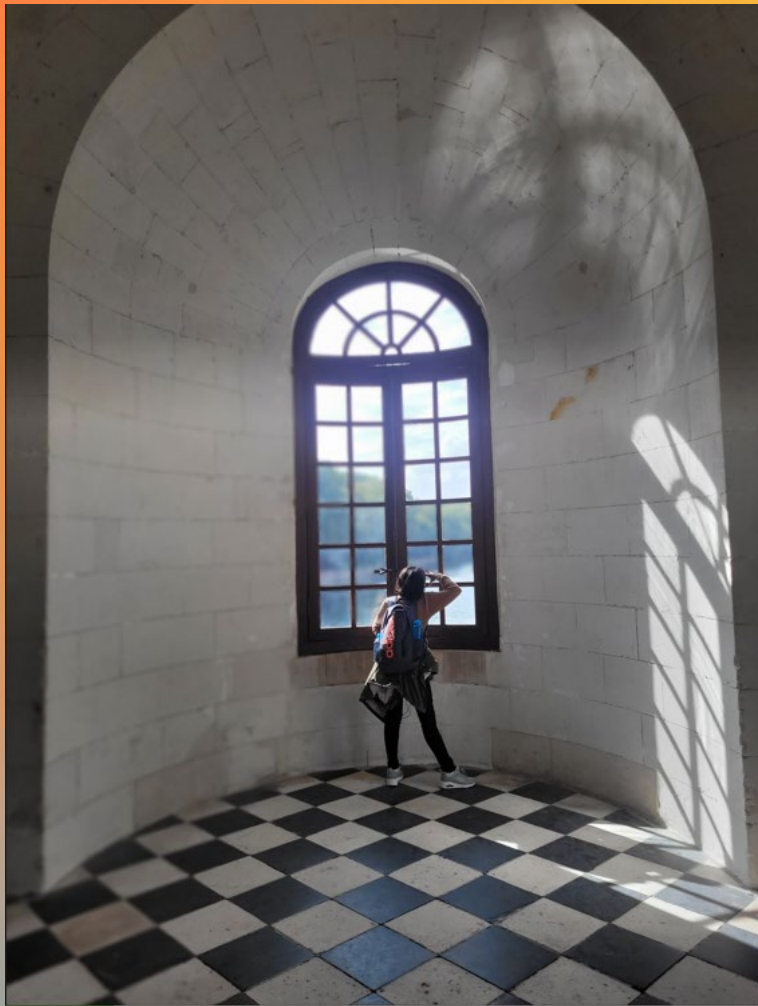

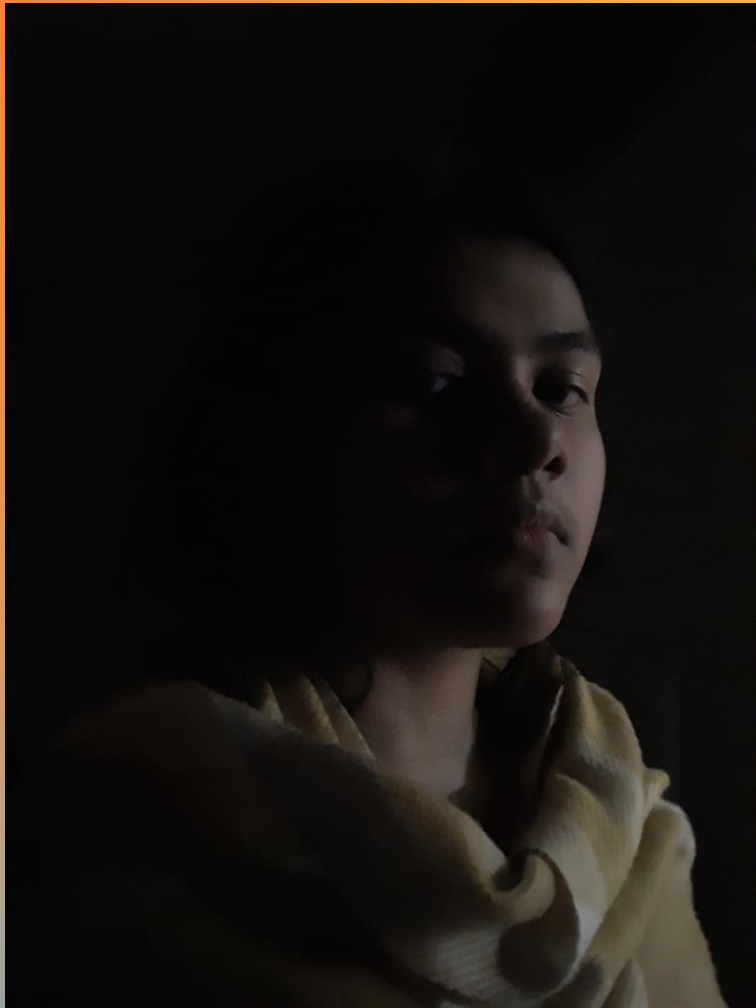

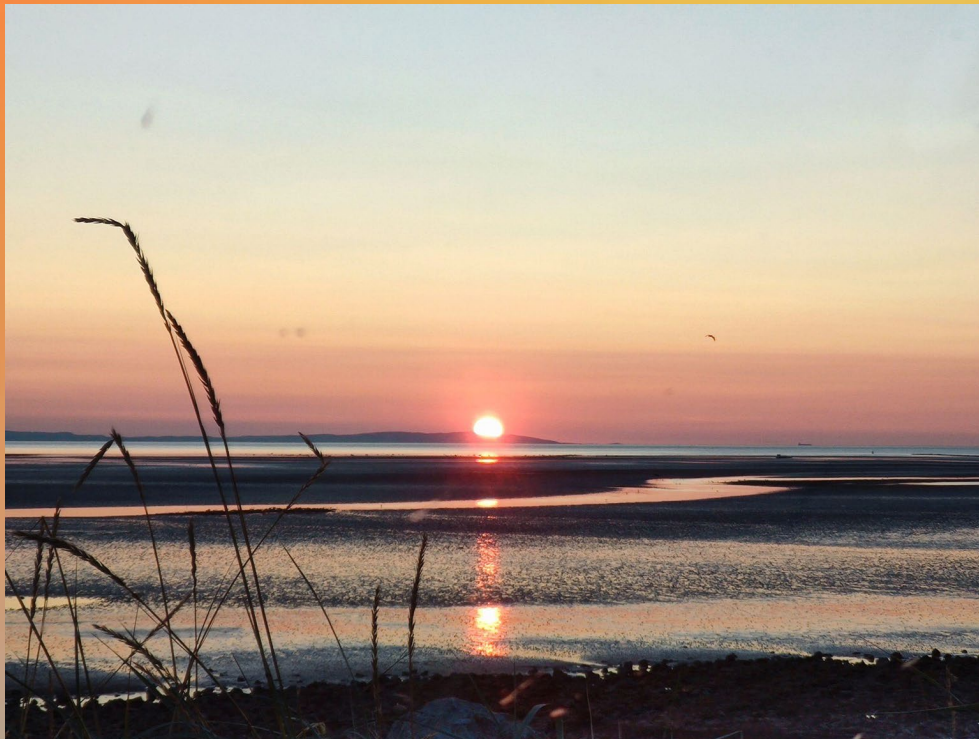
A photo with good composition and texture providing lots of contrast - very good!

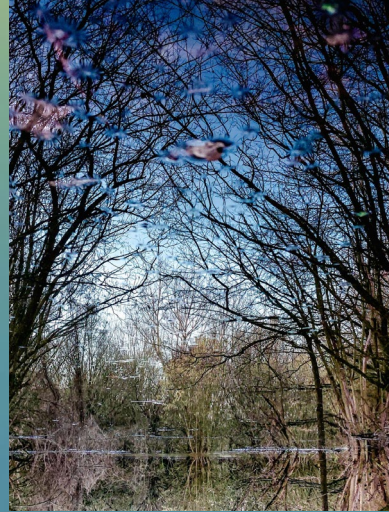
Amy Grace - Cedars - Y12

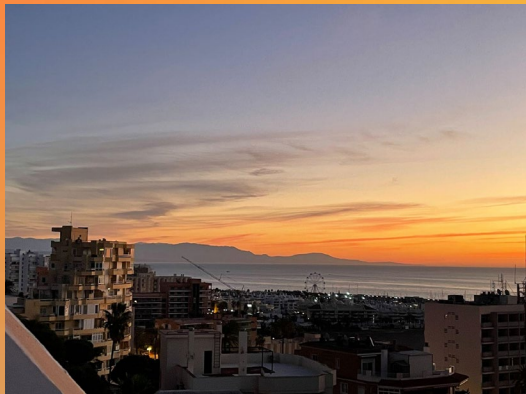

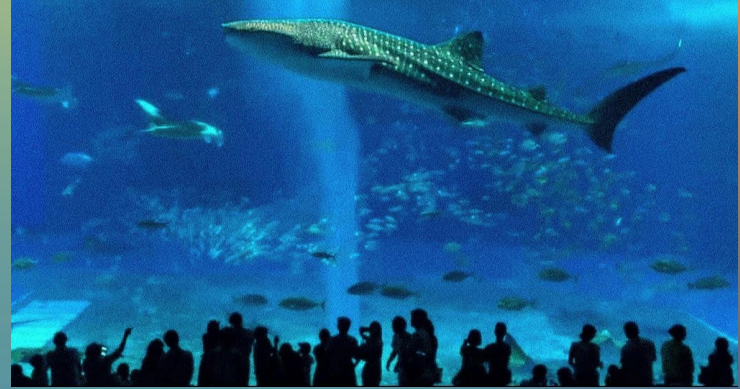
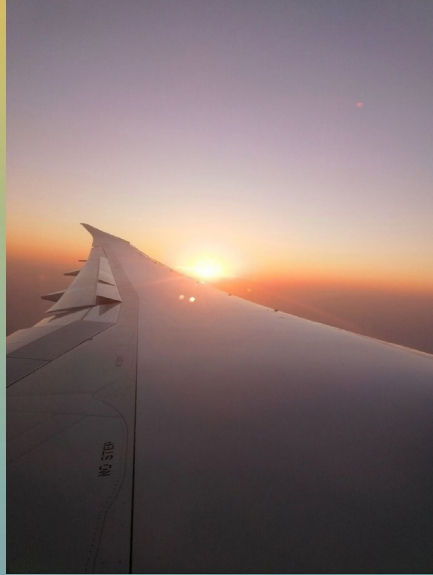
Katie - Sidmouth - Y12
